<p>Level 1.0</p>	<p>Students should be able to minimally demonstrate understanding of spoken words, syllables, and sounds in single-syllable words.</p>
<p>Level 0.5</p>	<p>With help, a partial understanding of some of the 2.0 content and none of the 3.0 content.</p>
